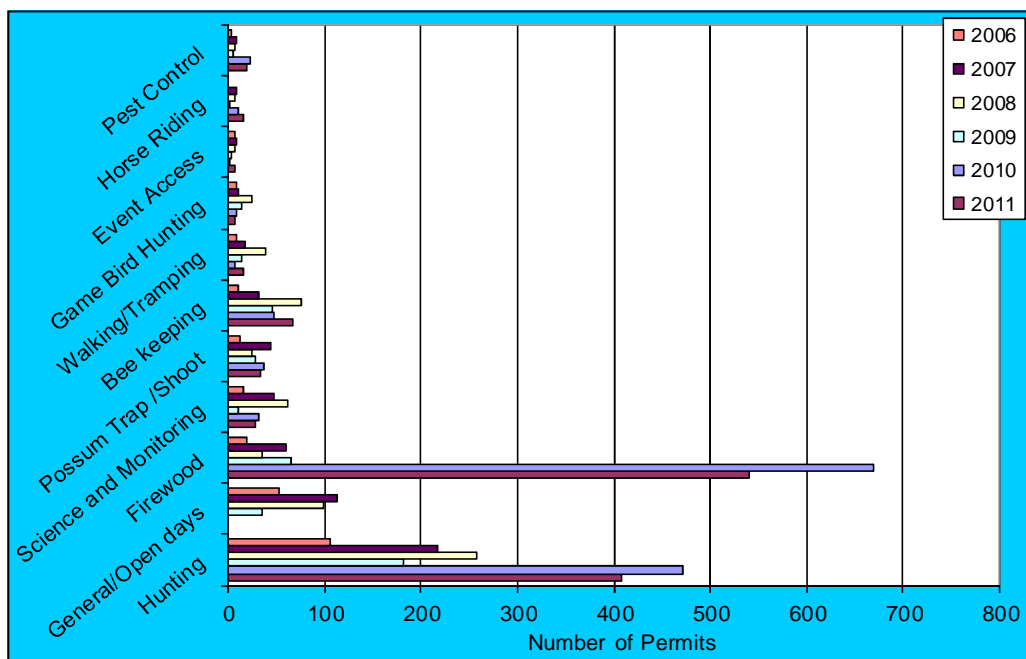
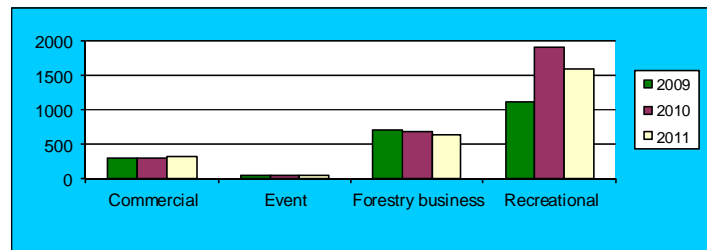
Recreational usage of the forests is permitted where it does not conflict with operational logistics and safety. Such usage ranges from passive use to active hunting or vehicle based activities.



Recreational usage is controlled through a permit system. Permits for small group scheme members are either controlled directly by the member or through PF Olsen Ltd's branch offices. Over the larger estates, permit entry is controlled through independent security contractors who not only manage the permit and compliance process but also coordinate between the often adjoining but variously owned forest estates. All permit data is accumulated in PF Olsen Ltd's databases.

Types of Permit

The graph to the right illustrates the relative proportions of permit types issued over the last several years ending June. Permits issued and categorisation as at June 2011 are graphed below for all FSC forests.

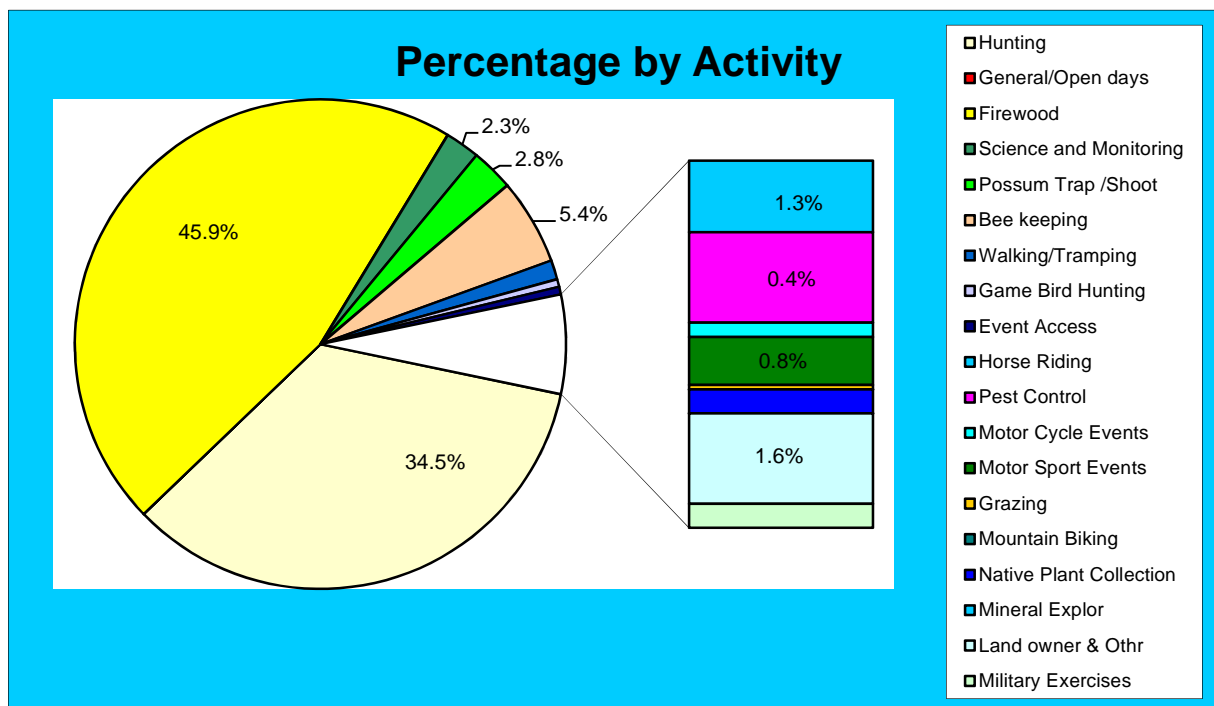


The table to the right details the major and minor categories of recreational and non-forestry production related activity occurring in the forests, while the graph below illustrates the major categories of permit issued by number in comparison with prior years comparable records.

Change of Measurement

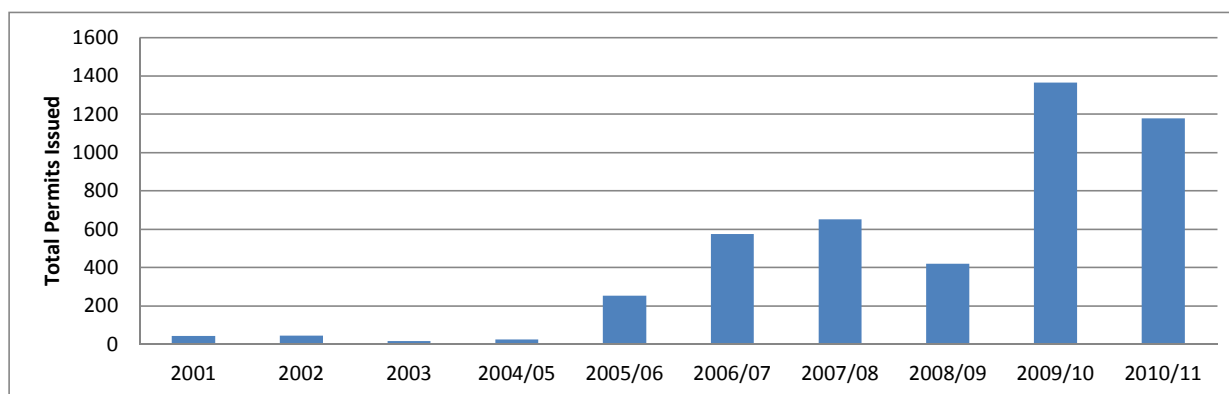
Past years statistics have included attempts to calculate total permitted visitor days. This data is very unreliable due to the fact that permits can apply over variable periods, variable numbers of people and will most often not be used every day that the permit is valid. Past data has been based on total available permit days multiplied by the permittees. This will significantly over-estimate visitor days.

For this reason for the 2005/06 year onward, the reporting focus moved to total permits issued and particularly the purposes for which the permits were sought.

Over the 2006/07 year the permit management software was also totally reformed in order to eliminate multiple records systems between offices and to ensure consistent categorisation of permits granted. The system now also provides better reporting and better tracking of permit holders obligations in respect of licences, insurances, kill returns and other data. This system was used for the first time to record all permits issued over the 2006/2007 year.

From the 2008/09 period, permits for the West Coast forests were amalgamated with the Group Scheme.

Hunting Kill Returns

Reporting hunting kill returns for each hunting permit is mandatory, even when the return is zero. With the permits now all managed through one database, it is now a simple task to collate hunting returns across the New Zealand-wide forest estate.

The statistics include pest control operations where data is available and increasingly that able to be inferred from Animal Health Board pest control and associated monitoring undertaken over PF Olsen managed FSC lands.

Below is a summary of hunting returns for all FSC and non-FSC forests. This data will be added to each year.
